	Drawing on the archive of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of South
	Africa, this paper considers the aesthetic, emotional and narrative
	dimensions of victims' trauma testimonies and explores how we think and
	write about trauma testimony in a way that opens up new interpretive
	domains in the field of historical trauma and its representation. First, I will
	focus on how body language and other forms of symbolic expression
	communicate a matrix of complex intersecting memories of traumatic loss in
	a way that reveals a deeper truth about the past that may not be articulable
	in verbal language. I will then discuss three different forms of responses to
	trauma testimony: communal responses, denial, and a visual arts illustration
	of a creative response to irreparable traumatic loss. In the final section of the
	paper I will argue that in the wake of massive loss and suffering, restoring
	human bonds among the wounded and the victimisers and their descendants
	involves a process of "repair", engagement with what I have called
	"reparative work in humanism" rather than the more commonly held goals of
