9:30-10:30am	Plenary Keynote & round table 'Witnessing Trauma: A Call to Reparative Humanism' Prof. Dr. Pumla Gobodo-Madikizela Research Chair in Studies in Historical Trauma & Transformation University Stellenbosch, South Africa Drawing on the archive of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of South Africa, this paper considers the aesthetic, emotional and narrative dimensions of victims' trauma testimonies and explores how we think and write about trauma testimony in a way that opens up new interpretive domains in the field of historical trauma and its representation. First, I will focus on how body language and other forms of symbolic expression communicate a matrix of complex intersecting memories of traumatic loss in a way that reveals a deeper truth about the past that may not be articulable in verbal language. I will then discuss three different forms of responses to trauma testimony: communal responses, denial, and a visual arts illustration of a creative response to irreparable traumatic loss.
